# Description

Twenty-one persons attended the public meeting held in the Chiltern Golf Club rooms on May 24th for the purpose of reforming the Friends of Chiltern Park group. Nine apologies were tendered. John McDonald Dept C.N.R, our friendly ranger, spoke about the objects of friends groups. He informed us of the following points:

- That friends groups are affiliated with DCNR and the Victorian National Parks Association (VNPA)
- 2. That the group could be formal, with a constitution, or informal, with an organizer and a newsletter
- 3. That the group may not undertake any activity which is seen to take work from DCNR staff

BRING Lunch, gloves, containers to hold weeds, small digging implement, CAPER SPURGE is a biennial weed, growing to roughly 75cms.

It is important to collect all the large seed heads.
