Local artist commissioned for Chiltern mural project – Neville Bartlett

The following is part of a media release from DELWP.

Chiltern artist Kirrily Anderson has been selected to highlight some of the area's most recognised inhabitants in a life size mural that will appear on a wall at the Chiltern Recreation Reserve later this year.

The mural will depict a wide variety of species, ranging from the well-known and loved Regent Honeyeater, a Barking Owl, the rare and delicate spider orchid, and the majestic Ironbark which provide essential food and shelter for these species.

The aim of the mural will be to show people what is in their area, and to encourage them to stroll along some incredible trails, take in the views, and seek out some of the rare and beautiful plants and animals found in the area, some of which are found nowhere else in Australia.

Planning is now underway for the installation of the mural, with work anticipated to commence in October.

Thank you very much to those who have contributed images.

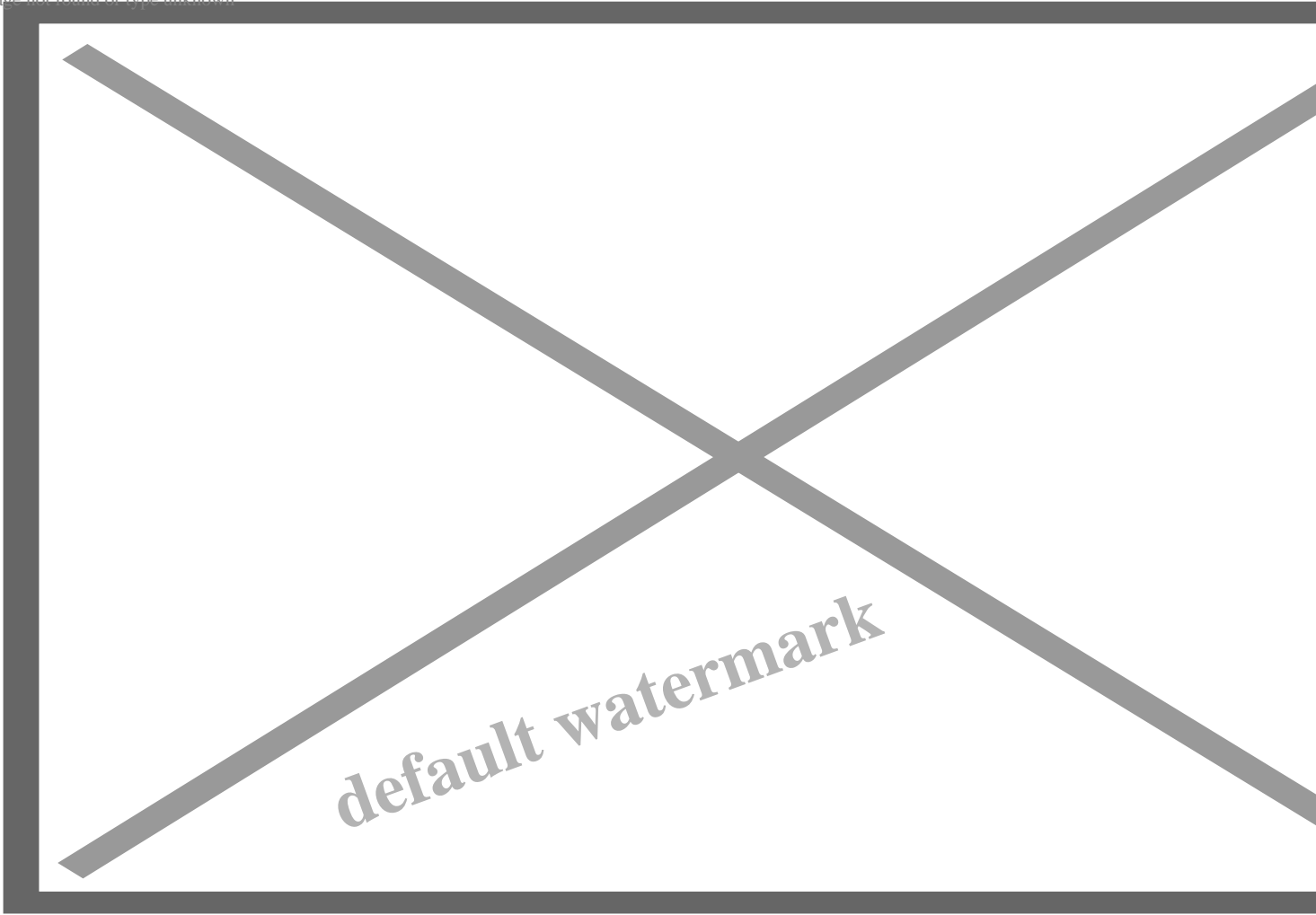
Around the Park

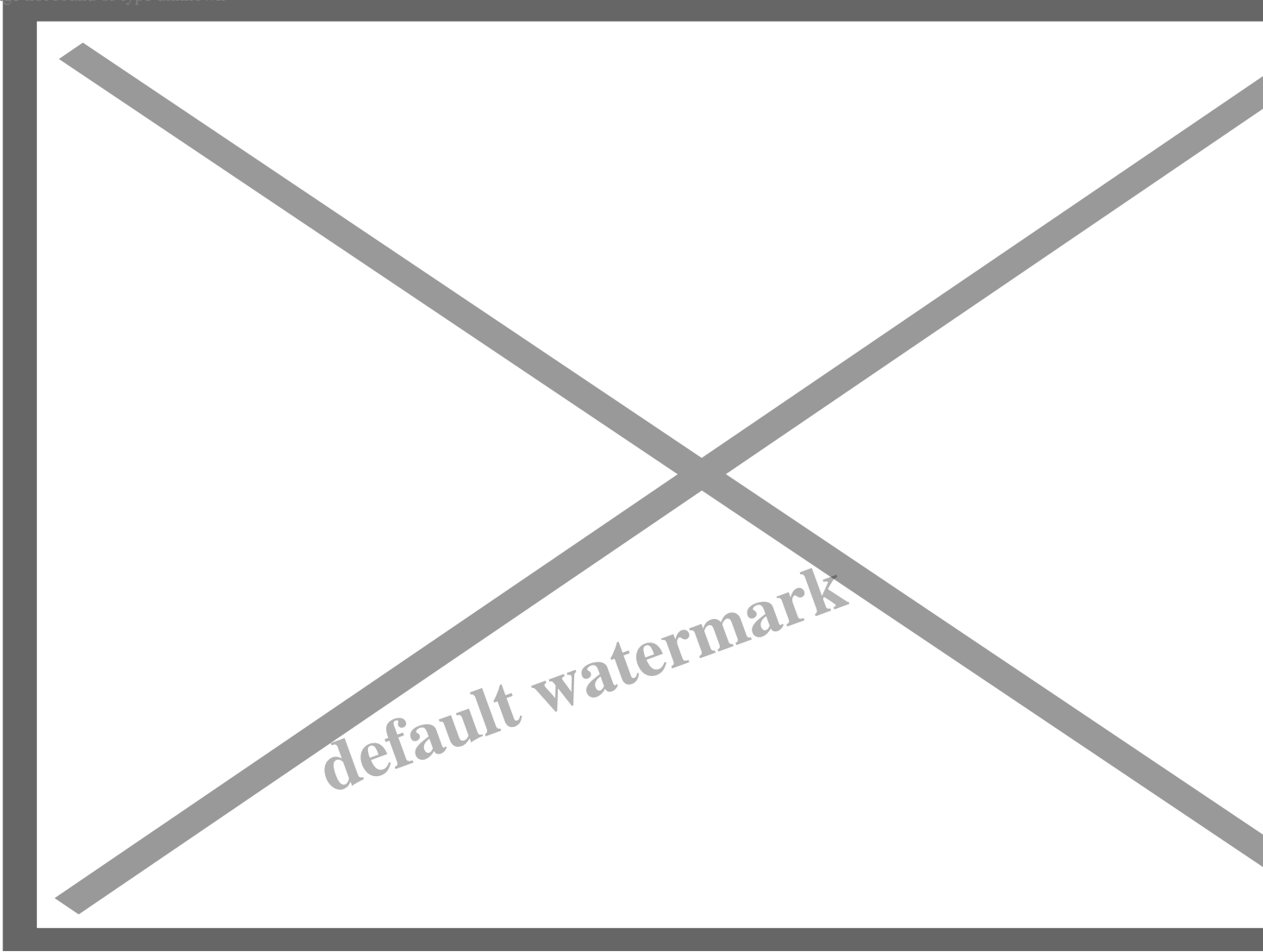
The Friends' FaceBook group has some excellent photos of orchids, other flowers and birds taken over recent weeks.

Friends AGM
