Ranger's Report - Brian Pritchard

Things in Parks Victoria a little unsettled at the moment with the Government undertaking a review of the organisation and the CEO departing. We have an acting CEO in place until end of March whilst a replacement is recruited.

We are currently working on reopening of some the ad hoc tracks that were recently closed at Reedy Creek. Ranger staffing will be a bit light on for the next few months with Scott taking leave until mid-February. Our main focus will be on visitor management and keeping the park Safe, Open and Clean. DEECA have completed slashing work and clearing of tracks prior to the fire season but will need to revisit due to recent weather events. Planning is also underway for this seasons planned burn program.

Contractors have commenced weed control spraying at Rutherglen Nature Conservation Reserve.

Turquoise Parrot (Neophema pulchella) - December image in the 2024 calendar

This small parrot has been one of the emblematic species of the park for many years. It feeds on the ground in grassy open forest and woodland. Usually seen in pairs or small groups feeding amongst grasses and herbs. It rarely flies far or above the canopy. Nesting often takes place in posts or tree stumps that are very close to the ground. Efforts to tempt this species to use man-made nestboxes have largely failed with only one instance where a nest box has been used.

The question of whether this species is mainly found in the Chiltern section of the Park was posed to the Head Park Ranger, Brian Pritchard and his response was: "I see Turq's are quite often in the Pilot and Barambogie areas from Indigo Valley end through to Eldorado. More often in the flatter open areas." DEECA Senior Scientist Ornithology, Bruce Quin replied: "Further to Brian's observations, I think the granite country habitat of Mt. Pilot/Barambogie is more to the Turquoise Parrot's liking than the sandstone country habitat around the Chiltern township. The numbers of Turq's in the park around Chiltern declined markedly during the drought but people were still reporting Turq's frequently around Mt. Pilot/Barambogie. I was glad to hear of several pairs of Turq's being seen recently in the eastern area of the park south of the highway recently."

Personal note: Many years ago, I contacted Eileen Collins to find out the best spots to see Turquoise Parrots. This led to my involvement with the Friends' group that continues today.

Rainfall: November 2024: 147 mm. Total for the year-to-date 2024: 558 mm. The corresponding total up to the end of November 2023 was 725 mm. This was the wettest November since 1912. We need 140 mm more in December to reach the annual average.

The average annual rainfall for Chiltern is 689 mm.

Rule of Thumb: For even months, the field day is held on the first Sunday of the month and for odd months, it is held on the first Saturday of the month.
