# April Field Day, Sunday 6th April 2025 - Liz Maertin and Helen Carse

On a bright, warm autumn morning 15 members met at the Chiltern P.O. before heading out to the National Park off Pine Road to weed a large clump of Tree of Heaven (*Ailanthus altissima*) and to remove pine seedlings which had migrated into the park from the adjoining pine plantation.

The group divided at the site with some digging out or cutting and pasting the Tree of Heaven. Some plants were 2-3 metres tall, but most were small and could be removed with mattocks, pulled out by hand (taking roots with them), or easily cut and poisoned.

The other group walked along Pine Rd searching out and removing pine seedlings before returning to assist with more Ailanthus weeding.

It was a pleasant, productive morning with most of the Tree of Heaven removed and all the pine seedlings and a few small olives dealt with.

Several members completed more removal, cutting and pasting of the remaining Tree of Heaven the following week; however, the site will need to be monitored in the next couple of months to check for regrowth as the plant spreads via underground suckers.

History of the pine plantation: John Hawker was able to give the group some interesting information about this plantation and the surrounding Park. Planted in the late 1960s, the pines are part of a HVP plantation. Within a few years of its establishment the plan was to clear the surrounding native bush to expand the plantation. At the time, the area of bush was a 'multipurpose' park which included Barambogie State Forest. In the early 1970s a campaign was launched by local groups opposed to the prospect of losing the native bush. This resulted in the protection of the forest which later became part of Chiltern-Mt Pilot NP, and restricted the pine plantation to its current and relatively small area.

### Field day dates for the remainder of 2025 and 2026

**For 2025**: Sunday 1<sup>st</sup> June, Saturday 5<sup>th</sup> July, Sunday 3<sup>rd</sup> August, Saturday 6<sup>th</sup> September, Sunday 5<sup>th</sup> October, Saturday 1<sup>st</sup> November and Sunday 7<sup>th</sup> December 2025.

**For 2026**: Sunday 1<sup>st</sup> February, Saturday 7<sup>th</sup> March, Sunday 5<sup>th</sup> April, Saturday 2<sup>nd</sup> May, Sunday 7<sup>th</sup> June, Saturday 4<sup>th</sup> July, Sunday 2<sup>nd</sup> August, Saturday 5<sup>th</sup> September, Sunday 4<sup>th</sup> October, Saturday 7<sup>th</sup> November and Sunday 6<sup>th</sup> December 2025.

**Rule of Thumb:** For even months, the field day is held on the first Sunday of the month and for odd months, it is held on the first Saturday of the month.
