### April Field Day

As expected there were some Parson's Bands (*Eriochilus cucullatus*) orchids in flower but the other Autumn flowering orchids had not yet appeared.

There are a number of different Eucalypts in the Pilot section of the Park that we can explore in later outings.

#### Pixie's Parasol (Mycena interrupta) - April image in the 2024 calendar

Fungi form a vital part of the biological framework in the environment. They convert nutrients in the soil into glycogen that can be used by themselves, plants, microbes and other organisms in the soil.

**Rule of Thumb:** For even months, the field day is held on the first Sunday of the month and for odd months, it is held on the first Saturday of the month.
