November Field Day

An enthusiastic gathering of workers headed to the Rutherglen Nature Conservation Reserve with the aim of removing olives, boxthorns, briars and any other feral plants. Hundreds of small plants were removed as people fanned out around the reserve. This activity is regularly required so that these feral plants do not get established sufficiently to produce seed. Even though the surrounding land is primarily used for farming, there are sufficient plants on road sides to supply a source of seed that is carried into the reserve by birds.

Over several years, Friends have planted trees and shrubs in the reserve and these plantings are thriving.

The reserve includes an exclusion area that is very effective at reducing the grazing pressure from the many local kangaroos.

We have known for some time that there were two Mountain Swainson pea (*Swainsona recta*) plants in this exclusion area since several seedlings had been re-planted at the site in recent years.

To our surprise, at least four healthy plants were found and that two of these plants had seed pods.

Six campsites have been signed and tree risk works undertaken along Reedy Creek.

Good Neighbour pest plant works have been planned and it is hoped contractors will complete spraying for blackberry, gorse and broom by end of December. These areas are all adjoining private land, in and around Beechworth and Reedy Creek.

When time and resources permit, rangers will be busy with the usual springtime maintenance (mowing, spraying) of our high visitation areas.
